

## **U.S. Customs & Border Protection Matching Game**

- 1. Agency which falls under Homeland Security combined legacy agency of the US Customs Service, Immigration and Naturalization Services, and Agriculture
- 2. Issued by the consular officer at a U.S Embassy allowing you to request permission from Customs and Border Officer to enter the United States lawfully
- 3. Place where dedicated customs presences therefor allowing lawful entry into the county
- 4. Government agency that was created in 2003 in response to the 9/11 terrorist attacks on the United States
- 5. Enables citizens or nationals of 39 participating countries to travel to the United States for tourism or business for stays of 90 days or less without obtaining a Visa
- 6. Largest component in Customs & Border Protection responsible for border security including anti-terrorism, immigration, anti-smuggling and agriculture
- 7. The designated Customs & Border Protection area where inspections of international travelers are conducted
- 8. Trusted travel program that allows expedited clearance for pre-vetted, low-risk travelers upon arrival in the United States
- 9. Self-service kiosk for travelers to use to answer inspections related questions and submit biographic information when entering the country
- 10.Government issued identification document proving citizenship for international travel
